In response to Mick Carter, Walton Road, Frinton-on-Sea who asked whether building site traffic and the use of traffic lights needed or had authority and should they not be encouraged to put hardstanding in place first — Councillor N.W. Turner advised that he was pursuing through Tendring District Council a Considerate Contractors Scheme to improve conditions and reduce nuisance for residents when development is taking place.

Councillor E.T. Allen expressed the view that any scheme would need the backup of enforcement.

# ELECTORAL REVIEW OF TENDRING: DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS

Members had been supplied with a full copy of the Draft Review from The Local Government Boundary Commission for England and considered the proposals for the Town Council area.

It was agreed that a letter be sent outlining the concerns Members of the Town Council had in relation to the parish of Great Holland being joined, for the purpose of a District Council to Thorpele-Soken and Beaumont. There would be a lack of synergy with the Town Council and due to the size and remoteness of the area it may discriminate against future potential candidates should they have no transportation.

# STAFF REMUNERATION

It was noted that the following Pay Awards will be implemented on 1 April 2017.

- a) Members of staff under the National Pay Award equates to 1% increase (previously agreed by the Town Council at a meeting held on 30 June 2016, Minute 60, page 33).
- b) Members of staff paid the National Living Wage will increase from £7.20 to £7.50 per hour.

# **NETWORK RAIL**

A copy of a letter received in regard to The Network Rail Transport & Works Act Order had been circulated with the agenda and the Town Clerk advised that a hardcopy with details of all 130 level crossings in the Anglia area across Cambridgeshire, Suffolk, Essex, Havering, Hertfordshire, Southend & Thurrock (300 pages in 2 large folders) had been received and are available at the Town Council offices.

It was noted that for the Town Council area the Extent of level crossing to be stopped up and discontinued is Bluehouse between points P327 and P328; that the Extent of highway to be extinguished is Footpath EX/164/16 (Frinton and Walton) P326, P327, P328, P329, P330 and P331 and the Status and extent of new highway is Footpath between points P326 and P332. Schedule 2 – closure of Level Crossings, page 33 of the Network Rail, Funding Statement titled The Network Rail (Essex and Others Level Crossing Reduction) Order.

# ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL - ROAD CLOSURES

- a) Receipt of the intended closure of Frinton Road, due to commence on Monday 8th May 2017 for 5 days while Essex County Council undertakes zebra crossing improvements was noted.
- b) Receipt of the intention of a temporary prohibition of traffic to Martello Road, Walton-on-the-Naze from its junction with B1034 High Street to its Junction with Station Street a distance of approx. 90m. (in conjunction with West Street Road closure) with effect on 1st April 2017 for 18 months or until the works have been completed, whichever is the earlier was noted. The Clerk was asked to write to Essex County Council requesting that the closures do not take place during July & August due to the increase traffic at this time.
